Tamara Currah, Sub 1: Early childhood learning opportunities are online. Meals are available to all Sub 1 students 18 and under. Free wifi hotspot in district parking lots.

Dave Siefkes, SCSO: DUI #s unchanged since COVID-19 slowdown, call volumes are down.

Kleif Guenther, WHP: Noticeable increase in calls related to domestic situations to WHP. Less enforcement is leading to people “making bad choices in extreme driving patterns.” Increase in mental health calls. WHP has been given broader ability to do welfare checks and to deliver medications to those who are shut-in.
