Community Reports:

Lt. Guenther, WHP: WHP underwent a substantial change in how they do business in order to protect troopers during COVID-19 restrictions. WHP starting to make more driving stops now and seeing speeding violations 8-10mph over average violations. WHP has been assisting SCSO with more mental health calls and more domestic incidents.

Joey Burke, SADD WY: Wyoming SADD will be launching a virtual campaign called Super Safe Summer. It will begin Memorial Day and run through Labor Day because it is considered the 100 deadliest days for teens. There will be weekly games, activities to educate youth on traffic safety, underage alcohol use, marijuana use, and youth drug trends. She is also beginning to plan Life. Are You Ready? Events throughout Wyoming.

Amber Anderson, PAC: PAC not seeing the volume of guests they thought they would see when they opened back up in a limited way. "People are being cautious."

Sarah Murdock, Food Basket, and Church of the Resurrection: 75 families signed up for today's food distribution. Numbers are down from what was expected. Church of the Resurrection starting to hold services this Sunday.

Janna Lee, Public Health: COVID 19 response team would like to continue having a volunteer coordinator in place for the future and the response team would like to use the Crisis Response Team as a resource.

Marlene Bauman and Dave Siefkes, SCSO: Sheriff's Office will be open with the rest of the courthouse May 18, back to doing VIN checks, working on how to do UA's, fingerprinting, and those activities impossible to do 6' apart.

Robert Galbreath, newspapers: Robert said thank you to the Sheriff's Office for doing the M-W-F live stream video, which helps in reporting on COVID.

Aaron Preece, High Country: Aaron thanked coalition members for all their efforts during this time, and said keep doing your self-care!
