**Approval of 3/10/22 Minutes.** Melinda noted that the 3/10/22 minutes do not include Randy Belton being present at the meeting. Minutes corrected.

**Janna Lee presented a report on grant financials for '23-'24:** Grant dollars are \$8000. less for the next cycle to reflect the drop in Sublette population in the 2020 census. Janna reported that based on the current grant cycle spending this amount should still fund all proposed costs and programming. There are also other funds available at the state level for specific programs/costs like the tobacco e-referral and Sources of Strength should the community choose those opportunities. Trisha spoke briefly on presenting to the Early Childhood Appreciation dinner Tuesday night on Adverse Childhood Experience (ACEs) risk and protective factors. Melinda noted that there are risk factors beyond individual family's control - like affordable housing. She requested that advocacy for affordable housing and other concrete supports for families, with town, county, and state leaders be added to the suicide prevention work plan. Discussion about overarching goals in each task area followed.

**Vote on the 2324 Work Plan proposal. Task Force Updates.**

**Peggy Weber Tobacco:** High Country Quit Tobacco classes completed Tuesday 4/12. 12 people received the class, 4-6 working on quitting or cutting back tobacco use. Working on a way to keep providing those quitting with NRT and coaching, post class.

Tonia Hoffman from the SCHD is working with us to get the “1 click e-referral” software into the district. This will connect patients who express interest in quitting with the quitline through the district EHR. Tonia will present to the board, medical director, and providers this month.

**Tobacco Work Plan proposal.**

- Provide “1 click e-referral to the quitline” software program to the medical clinics to connect all patients who say yes I want help quitting to the quitline.
- Offer 3 Quit classes per year at HCBH. Provide free NRT to classes. Train 1 quit coach at HCBH. Provide food/incentives.
- Offer \_\_\_ classes per year to the public through the medical clinics. Provide free NRT. Train 1-2 quit coaches for the clinics. Provide all marketing and training costs. Provide food/incentives to classes.
- Provide new “nicotine free campus” signage to the schools. Continue to encourage cessation options in school policies.
- Retailer toolkit., including clock (you must be born before this date to purchase...).
- Continue parent education through media.
- IF there is vigorous interest from a good cross section of the coalition in volunteering at select athletic events through the ‘22 - ‘23 school year, we will staff tables offering info on vapes etc. to the community.
- Identify school liaison for all tobacco prevention opportunities.
- Collaborate with 5 county western Wyoming region to educate lawmakers on tobacco tax increase.

**Melinda: Adult Overconsumption and Underage Drinking Prevention proposal:**

- TIPs trainings offered 4x a year . TIPS includes distribution of annual ID Checking guides: recertification costs for trainers, T4T for a new trainer if necessary; all testing and certificate costs, marketing, food for training, and thank yous on social media.
- Media: Continue the harm reduction media campaign through print and social media: Message: What you do impacts children more than you might think. Tagline: “If you are over 21 and you choose to consume alcohol, please consider the moderate drinking formula. No more than 1 drink per day for women, no more than 2 drinks per day for men.” Collaborate on all alcohol media with the Sheriff’s Office. Share media with Sheriff’s office whenever possible. Use local data when appropriate.
- Media for Underage drinking: Focus on conversation starters for parents of teens with tagline: Keep Asking. Keep Talking. They hear you. Focus on safety planning message using Surgeon General’s risks.
- Provide event toolkit to towns for town alcohol permits. Provide wristbands, ID scanners, beer cups, designated driver schwag. Provide/collaborate on water station at town events

- Collaborate on September Teen Driving Rodeo with local organizations
