Community Reports:

Tessa Wilson, SAFV: Federal and state cutting funds to SAFV have required SAFV to cut Tessa's job. Tessa hoping to remain in Sublette. We hope she remains in Sublette, too.

Dave Siefkes, Sheriff's Office has had very tough several months with 4 fatalities, 2 due to no seat belts and distracted and impaired driving; 1 accidental gunshot death and 1 suicide. Protests against law enforcement across the country affect decision making about LE presence at prevention events.

Mardy Sleight: Kids in Big Piney are struggling with the tragic and sudden loss of 2 kids in the past 2 months. Mardy is talking to teens who are grieving their friend's death and feeling hopeless about the future due to covid. It is an important time to get warning signs of suicide out into the public, to train parents, and to train youth groups.
