Team members viewed the documentary "Dead on Arrival" on the increase and impacts of teen fentanyl overdoses. Film explored the dangers of street fentanyl, the ability of kids and adults to order fentanyl over social media and to have it delivered to their door.

Discussion: What is the best way to share this information with parents and the community? Melinda said it is probably not great as a "one off". Team suggested that we post the link on the website and notify all county school health educators and SRO's that it is there. Possible share at school parent teacher conferences.

Carolyn reported there is no drug education at Pinedale Middle School at this time. DARE was proven to be ineffective overtime.

Janel recommended sharing on Sublette 4 sale to get the word out to the broadest Sublette audience.

Janna and Trisha did a 20 minute overview of how systems mapping can be used to identify risk and protective factors in all prevention work. The team used the strategy to identify community risk and protective factors that have an impact on youth tobacco use.

Visibility

Vapes are manufactured to be concealable and that is attractive to youth

Low level legal consequences

Protective Factors:

School enforcement and school consequences

Limited availability

Sports

Religion

Noted that sports and availability are in both columns, risk and protective.
